10. Description of good practice and it's activities

Before each election at the city, state, and federal levels, leading candidates from Graz and Styria are asked questions about their feminist political orientation to provide voters with guidance on women's politics.

The questions cover the following topics:

- Education
- Labor market
- Compatibility of private caregiving and domestic work
- Health
- Gender-based violence
- Political representation
- Gender mainstreaming/Gender budgeting

The results are published through newspapers, events, social media, websites of the networks and member organizations, and panel discussions with politicians.

In this way, voters are informed about the positions of candidates from different parties on important women's political issues.

The concept of "DAMENWAHL" has been adopted by the Austrian Women's Ring for Vienna and Salzburg and adapted to regional circumstances.

12. Lessons learne	 It is advisable to gather extensive knowledge and data on institutional and social aspects.
	 All channels should be used to publish the results, and discussions with various target groups should take place. The results should be collected and used for the next steps.
13. Success factors of the practice	 Background knowledge Processing of social science data over time to show development. Formulating a few clear and concise questions that cover all areas: They must be clear and unambiguous. This requires extensive background knowledge. Invest a lot of energy in public relations.
14. Ways in which the practice could be improved	To achieve improvement, the Austrian "DAMENWAHL" could be compared with other countries.
	We, the Graz Women's Council and several women's organizations, are planning a proposal for an international project in which we aim to compare the different situations in various countries. For this, we will select countries with varying levels of women's representation in politics and in the electoral system. Before the selection, we will create a cluster based on the abovementioned criteria. Then, we will adapt and compare the concept of "DAMENWAHL."
